- This year, the library class initiative is "We L.O.V.E. Books!" The L.O.V.E. acronym stands for Learn, grow, and Observe, eVery day to Excel. Mr. Boynton will help you keep a record of books you read. If you practice scheduling reading for 20 minutes every day at home, you will be able to read 40 books and grow in your literacy skills.
- Remember, all our library readers have a right to read! This means you and your child are
 the ultimate decision makers as to what you will read for fun. Searching, returning, and
 trying something new at the library are all important parts of learning to love reading.

Book Check-out Policies

- We will start checking out books on Tuesday, September 7th. Each grade level will be allowed to check out books with the following guidelines. These guidelines will be updated and increased over the next months as we practice caring for books.
 - Kindergarten: one book during library time to be kept in classrooms
 - 1st: one book during library time to be kept in classrooms
 - o 2nd: one book during library time allowed to take home
 - 3rd: two books during library time allowed to take home
 - 4th-6th: two or three books allowed to take home.
- When your student takes a library book home, please remember it has been checked out to their student account and the responsibility to take care of the book and return it becomes the student's AND their family's. We will not be charging late fees and can work together to manage lost or damaged books. But the BEST way to have a great library is for EVERYONE to do their part.
 - When the book is at home, keep it in the student's backpack or another safe place so it doesn't get lost or damaged!
 - Remember to bring your book back to the LLC each week!
 - Keep food, water, pets, and anything else destructive away from books!
 - If you don't like the book you checked out, return it and choose a different one!
